

FAQ - BANDO ERASMUS+ 2026/2027

Civil and Industrial Engineering Faculty

The following Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) provide useful information to participate in the Erasmus+ for Study Call for Applications 2026/2027. It's advised to read carefully the Call and consult the Responsible Academic for the Mobility about specific doubts.

How can I participate in the Erasmus program?

The student who intends to participate in the Erasmus+ can apply online as indicated in the Call published every year between December and January. Here you can find the page with all the information and the University's FAQ: <https://www.uniroma1.it/it/pagina/erasmus-mobilita-studenti>

Who are the contact persons for the various procedures?

What is the PFP (Preliminary Study Plan)?

It is a document drawn up by the student during the application phase, which includes both the foreign courses that the student intends to take during the mobility period and the respective Italian exams that the student intends to validate upon return. **It is subject to evaluation for the purposes of ranking.**

Once the PFP has been finalized, does it need to be approved by the RAM before the application can be completed?

At this stage, you do not need any formal approval from the RAM. However, it is ESSENTIAL to consult the RAM for your degree programme BEFORE completing the PFP in order to assess the academic consistency between the courses and their compatibility with your study plan.

What is the difference between the PFP and the Learning Agreement?

The PFP is a preliminary assessment document that you submit during the application phase. The Learning Agreement, on the other hand, is the official document that you will fill out ONLY if you are selected, and it must be formally approved by the RAM and the mobility office before departure. The Learning Agreement may contain changes from the initial PFP, but it must always comply with the educational requirements of the course of study.

Are there any educational restrictions on the choice of courses to be included in preliminary training programmes?

During the application phase, the PFP is evaluated in terms of its completeness and overall consistency. However, some degree programmes may have specific educational restrictions (e.g. prerequisites, maximum number of credits that can be validated, compulsory courses that cannot be substituted, etc.).

It is ESSENTIAL to check these restrictions with your RAM BEFORE completing the PFP to avoid proposing projects that cannot be approved. The RAM can provide precise information on which courses can or cannot be validated.

Can I take an exam from the three-year degree programme at the host university if I am enrolled in a master's degree programme?

You must check with the RAM (Academic Adviser) for your degree programme after verifying the courses offered at the location of interest. Some master's degree programmes may have specific restrictions on the level of courses that can be validated.

How do I choose the host institution?

You will find useful information on mobility and the destinations you can choose from on the [destinations portal](#). When making your choice, you will need to take the following factors into account:

- ISCED CODE*, which must be associated with your degree programme (see the list of degree programmes and areas of study on the page).
- Language requirements of the host institution
- Level of study (1 - Bachelor's degree; 2 - Master's degree; 3 - PhD).

*Code 071 (or 0710) can be used for all engineering degree programmes, subject to verification of the specifications listed in the “other information” field and/or the educational offerings of the foreign institutions.

Can I apply for a scholarship lasting two semesters even if I only want to study abroad for one semester?

Yes, you can apply for a scholarship lasting longer than the period you actually intend to use it for.

The foreign university requires knowledge of two languages, but I only meet the language requirement for one of the two languages. Can I still choose it as my destination?

Before applying, make sure that there are actually courses in the language you are eligible for and that these courses are of interest and accessible for a possible mobility programme. Some locations

still require knowledge of both languages for student acceptance, regardless of the language in which the courses are taught.

Does the foreign university require official certificates to meet the language requirement?

The information and related web pages are listed on the [destinations portal](#). However, the locations may change requirements and/or procedures, and it is the responsibility of students to independently verify that they meet the requirements according to the methods and deadlines of the foreign locations. Therefore, please check for each location whether and which language certifications are required.

The places available for the language test are full. Is there any way I can still take the test?

I am a foreign student. Can the Erasmus office of my faculty help me with information regarding entry visas for different countries?

No, it is the student's responsibility to promptly find out about the entry requirements of the countries they are considering applying to. Please note that in some countries, the issuance of a visa is subject to declarations/documents certifying the availability of certain financial resources.
